Fair Auction Requirement

Don't forget that in order to sell a project item or animal in the fair auction, a 4-H member must attend at least three club meetings during the 4-H year (started in October). The official record of meetings attended will be the club secretary's book. This rule will be enforced at the 2017 fair.

4-H BBQ

Help is needed to set-up for, serve, and clean-up after the 4-H BBQ on Thursday at the County Fair. Each club will need to have at least 2 adults and 2 4-H members working for the entire time of 4:00 to 7:00pm. Extra help will be requested earlier that day for preparation of the meal. Each club is asked to submit their list of workers to the Extension Office by 5:00pm on July 17th.

Fair Exhibitor Numbers

Don't forget to put your exhibitor number on all entry cards for Fair. These numbers were included in the June 4-H Newsletter.

Food Stand Details

Angela Day will be managing and providing workers for the concession stand this year. Charge cards will still be available for 4-H families to use.

Public Revue Talent

Any 4-H member may participate in the Public Revue by presenting a talent number. If you are interested, you can either contact the Extension Office by noon on July 17th or sign up at Fashion Revue Judging.

Photography and Horticulture Judging Contests

The 4-H Photography and Horticulture Judging Contests will be held on Wednesday, July 26th at the Fair. The contests begin at 10:00am. 4-Hers can begin judging any time after the start of the contest, but all forms must be turned in by Noon. You do not have to be enrolled in any specific projects to participate. Please plan to judge!

4-H Council has decided to have an After-Fair Family Celebration again this year. This event will be held on Friday, July 28th at the city pool from 7:15 to 9:00pm and will include swimming and snacks. Please plan to attend and celebrate the end of fair!

Horse ID Papers

Don't forget to bring your horse ID papers with you to the 4-H Horse Show. You are required to have these papers in order to participate.

New Round Robin Champion Recognition

Thanks to the sponsorship of Agri Trails Coop, we will now have a plaque to recognize the grand champion Round Robin recipient of the fair each year. The champion's name will be engraved on the plaque that will be on display at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center in the showcase.

2017 Herdsman Trophy

Geary County Farm Bureau has generously volunteered to sponsor \$100 for the winner of the Herdsman Award again this year. The Herdsman Trophy will be presented to the club who keeps their areas in the livestock barn the cleanest and neatest. In addition, part of the award will be based on each club's percentage of participation in pre-fair clean-up/set-up. Don't forget to sign in if you help with this so that you can get credit. See the fair book for more information.

Conference Judging

Parents and leaders who wish to observe conference judging should check with the Superintendent of the division to see if that is acceptable with the judge. If so, they can watch and listen to the judging, but should not enter into the conference between the 4-Her and the judge in any way. Foods Tables

Foods exhibits will be displayed on club tables again this year. 4-H Council passed a motion to leave decorations up to the clubs with the decorations limited to tiers and a tablecloth in order to save space for exhibits. Some clubs with few exhibits may have to share a table with another club.

Auction Reminder

Just a reminder that 4-H members who sell an item in the project auction or an animal in the livestock auction need to personally thank the buyer. The Extension Office will notify you when the buyer ribbons and certificates are ready that you will take to the buyer. The 4-Her needs to speak to the buyer, this is not a task for parents. In 2017, buyers will again be asked to sign-off that the youth have visited them before any money will be released.

Staying Overnight at the County Fair

4-H members who plan to stay overnight at the fair to care for livestock are responsible for having the form turned in at the 4-H Fair Office by 2:00pm on Tuesday, July 25th. All 4-Hers must have a 4-H parent stay with them that will be responsible for their safety and behavior. One parent will be responsible for NO more than six 4-Hers. A sibling over 18 may sign to stay only with his/her siblings. At 11:00pm all 4-Hers and youth that do not have permission to stay must go home.

Loading-Out Fair Livestock

The load-out process for livestock on Thursday evening of the fair will be done in the following order: 1) locker plants; 2) floor animals; and 3) individual animals returning home. You are allowed to load tack out ahead of the 8:00pm release time, but not animals or you will forfeit all premiums. Your cooperation in this load-out process is greatly appreciated.

Valuables at Fair

Just a reminder that electronics, valuables, and other items should not be left lying around during the fair. The 4-H/Senior Citizens Center is a public building and should be treated as such, including the restrooms.

Dogs on Fairgrounds

Fair Board has ruled that no dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds during the Geary County Free Fair, July 23-27. Thanks for abiding by this rule!

Kansas State Fair Exhibitor Handbook

Pre-entry of State Fair Exhibits

Any 4-H member who wants to enter an exhibit at the State Fair must pre-enter with the Extension Office by August 1st. Look to the fair book to see which classes are eligible for State Fair entry. A 4-H member must receive a purple ribbon in one of these classes and be 9-18 years old as of January 1, 2017 to exhibit at state fair. The exception to the August 1st pre-entry deadline is for livestock. Livestock must be pre-entered by July 15th.

Assistance for Kansas State Fair

Volunteers are being sought to help with the 4-H portion of the Kansas State Fair which will be held September 8th through 17th. If you are willing to assist, please let the Extension Office know by August 1st.

Achievement Celebration

The Achievement Celebration has been set for the evening of Sunday, October 15th. Please put this date on your calendar and look for further details in upcoming newsletters.

Record Books & Award Applications due

Record Books, Key Award Applications, I Dare You Award Applications, and Achievement Pin Applications are due to the Extension Office by 5:00pm on September 15th. No late items will be accepted. These items will be due to club leaders before this date, check with your leader to find out when.

Club Summary Due Date

Club summaries will be due by 5:00pm on October 2nd to the Extension Office. No late summaries will be accepted.

County-Wide Sheep & Meat Goat Project Meeting

A county-wide sheep and meat goat project meeting will be held on Sunday, July 16th from 6:30 to 8:00pm at the fairgrounds. Participants will learn about show ring basics while getting hands-on practice leading and setting up animals. Bring your own sheep and/or goat if you can, if not a couple extra will be available to learn with. Don't forget to wear closed toe shoes, bring show chains, folding chairs, and bottled water.

Food Exhibiting Tips

FREEZING – Freezing baked products before the fair is acceptable. Be sure they are completely thawed before the judging. Use good storage containers; airtight plastic containers are recommended. Thaw baked goods slowly (in the refrigerator) in the container, bag, or wrap in which they were frozen. This minimizes moisture loss.

BAKING TIPS

**Practice making baked entries several times before the final preparation of your fair entry.

**Start early, so you can improve your skills and make changes to recipes.

**Do not over-mix muffin or cupcake batter; over-mixing causes tunnels.

**Foam cakes should have a rough, slightly cracked top crust; use week old eggs; allow egg whites to come to room temperature before beating; exhibit in upright position with top crust showing.

**Use solid shortening to grease pans rather than oil or spray.

**Whole wheat products are to contain at least 50% whole wheat flour.

**Quick breads do not contain yeast.

**Grease muffin pans and quick bread pans on bottom only to avoid a “fry line” around the top edge of baked products.

**Use hydrogenated shortening instead of butter or margarine in cake frostings. It has a melting point of 127°F and produces a better product in hot weather.

**No cream cheese frostings allowed.

FAIR FROSTING (not required, just an example)

½ cup vegetable shortening

1 tsp. vanilla

1 lb. (4 cups) powdered sugar

3 TBS. milk

Blend together shortening and sugar. Add vanilla and milk; beat until smooth. Makes 2 ½ cups frosting for two 8” or 9” layers or a 9” x 13” cake. If frosting seems a little stiff for spreading, set the bowl in warm water so the frosting (actually the shortening in it) will soften.

How to Assemble Your Record Book

Record Book contents should be placed in this order (please ignore the instructions for organizing the Kansas 4-H Award Portfolio on the front page of each KAP, follow these instruction instead):

1. The **Personal Page**

List projects in alphabetical order

A current picture is a must

Picture does not need to be as big as the space allowed, attach picture to another piece of paper that will cover the space

Signatures are very important

2. Your **4-H Story**

Not to exceed six pages

Double spaced on one side of the paper

Overview of the entire 4-H year

Should include:

-goals (goals that were set and work accomplished)

-leadership (leadership given to club, county, state, or national levels)

-involvement (show degree of involvement in 4-H throughout the year)

-projects (touch on each project briefly)

3. **General 4-H Pictures**

Maximum of three pages of photos

One side of paper

Mounted on medium-weight paper (heavy enough to support pictures, but flexible enough for pages to turn easily)

Use rubber cement for attaching rather than photo corners, white glue, or tape

Should have captions

Should show action

No plastic sleeves

4. A copy of your Kansas 4-H **Permanent Record**. (the Permanent Record should be continually updated from year to year and the record for your entire 4-H career should be included)

5. The **Kansas 4-H Award Portfolio** (KAP) for each project.

Each project should be separated with divider tabs

Should be in alphabetical order as listed on Personal Page

6. **Project Pictures**

Maximum of three pages for each KAP

Older 4-H members using the longer version of the KAP must include one page each for project involvement, leadership, and citizenship

Follow guidelines for General 4-H Pictures

Individual KAP stories will not count for or against the record

Project manuals or ribbons should not be included

Past year's records should not be included

Use tabs for each part of the record, including a tab for each KAP

CLOTHING CONSTRUCTION/FASHION REVUE JUDGING/ PUBLIC REVUE INFORMATION - 2017

Monday, July 17th all clothing construction and fashion revue judging will be held. Clothing construction judging will be held at the Extension Office and fashion revue judging will be held at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center. A schedule for clothing and fashion revue judging is enclosed.

CLOTHING CONSTRUCTION judging will begin at 8:00am. The judging schedule is enclosed. Please refer to the fair book for labeling instructions.

MODELING ASSISTANCE AND FASHION REVUE PRACTICE: At noon at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center volunteers will work with 4-H members on modeling. All members will have a chance to practice modeling. (Be sure to bring the shoes you'll be wearing in the fashion revue judging so you will be comfortable walking and turning in those shoes.) Members will have the opportunity to practice modeling on the stage and moving to and from the judge's table.

FASHION REVUE: Judging of fashion revue begins at 1:00pm at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center. Judges have been instructed to come early so that they can receive their instructions and be in place and ready to go by 1:00. We will try to start on time and stay on schedule, however, your patience is requested if judging runs early or late.

You will need an entry card for each outfit you are modeling. You may get entry cards at the Extension Office before Monday, or at the judging on Monday.

Please note page 29 of the fair book which has a list of items to be brought to the judging.

SOME THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW:

- Garment numbers will be used to identify your outfit. This number will be used on the sheet the judges utilize for evaluating your outfit instead of your name. You will need to have the correct number on with the group as listed on the schedule. After you appear in the outfit, the number must stay on it. Your number(s) are listed on the enclosed schedule. We will have the materials to make numbers at the registration table.
- You have been divided into groups within your division and age. The groups you are in and the times they should start are on the enclosed schedule.
- Before leaving fashion revue judging, you must complete a public revue script with detailed information on the outfit(s), talent, etc. you are presenting at public revue.**
- Please bring clothing to the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center during setup on July 23rd or Foods Judging on July 24th to be displayed for the fair. Items should be brought on swivel hangers. Entry cards should be attached to garments and other items judged for construction. Members must have articles on display at the fair to collect ribbons and premium money.

FASHION REVUE JUDGING PROCEDURE

- You have been placed in a group with other 4-H members in your age range. Your group will line up together, however, you will be judged on an individual basis.
- When it is your turn to model, hand all of your paperwork to the person who is assisting the judge. Then give the judge an overall look at your outfit by modeling. Be sure you make several turns, pausing with your back to the judge long enough for them to get a good look at the fit of your clothes. After you have finished modeling, step up to the judge's table and see if they have any questions. They may ask you why you chose the outfit, how much it cost, how you care for it, what you like best about it, etc. When the judge is finished interviewing you, he/she may ask you to model again before returning to your group.
- When all members of your group have finished their individual modeling and consultation with the judge, your group will walk back in front of the judge.
- As with any 4-H judging event, eye contact is important.
- The judges will assign you a purple, blue, red, or white ribbon just as they do in other divisions at the fair. You will not find out which ribbon you received until Thursday, July 20th at the 4-H Public Revue. (Purple ribbons are the exception as they will be called back.)
- The judges will select several garments throughout the afternoon to return at the end of the judging to be considered for Division Champion and Division Reserve Champion. Please do not leave the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center until the call backs from your group have been posted. Double check to see which number garment has been called back to be sure you model the correct garment. All call-backs are purple ribbon winners. You will not find out who has been named Division Champion or Division Reserve Champion until Public Revue on July 20th.
- You are encouraged to attend the practice scheduled ahead of judging. This will give you an opportunity to go up and down steps and practice on the stage. It is not always possible to stay on schedule so we ask that you arrive early and stay flexible throughout the day. We want to make sure everyone has time to visit with the judge about their project.
- Remember, if you have constructed your garment, it must be judged for construction in the morning in order for it to be entered in the fashion revue. As stated in the fair book, only garments can be modeled in this division. If you signed up to model a pillow or a bag, you were not included on the constructed fashion revue schedule for this reason.

PUBLIC REVUE: This is the fashion revue we hold for the public on Thursday, July 20th at 7:00pm. The event includes the announcement of clothing and fashion revue champions and crowning of the fair king and queen. Participation in this event is encouraged, but is not required. If participating, you must complete a public revue script with detailed information before leaving fashion revue judging.

Setup and decorating for Public Revue will be held on July 20th at 8:30am.

Public Revue practice is required for all participants and will be held on July 20th at 5:30pm. Please be on time for practice so we can run through the event before the public starts to arrive. If you are modeling two outfits in the Public Revue, you can find out which outfit you will be modeling first by visiting <http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html> or contacting the Extension Office. This will allow you to come dressed and ready. Doors to the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center will be open at 5:00pm if you would like to bring clothes and get dressed there.
