Project Drop/Add Deadline	May 1 will be the last day you can drop or add projects for county fair. This means that if you do not add the project by that date, you will not be eligible to exhibit in that area at the fair. Sign in to your 4-HOnline account to see what projects you are enrolled in and to drop or add projects. As a reminder, the 4-HOnline website address is <u>https://v2.4honline.com</u> . A step-by-step guide to editing projects in 4HOnline is available at <u>https://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/index.html</u> . Contact the Extension Office if you have problems logging in or editing projects.
Fair Books	Fair books should be distributed at May 4-H club meetings. If you do not attend your club meeting, please call the Extension Office to arrange to pick up your book as soon as possible following your meeting. The book is also available on the web located at <u>http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/fair.html</u> . Pre-entries will be filled out through FairEntry this year. This is an online fair management program that we will be using. Instructions on submitting pre-entries will be provided after May 1. Please read over the fair book carefully for complete rules and exhibit options. Fair pre-entries are due through FairEntry by 11:59pm on June 27 th .
National Volunteer Week	National Volunteer Week is April 20-26, 2025. The purpose of this week is to recognize and celebrate the efforts of volunteers on all levels. Thank you to the many volunteers who make 4-H "work" for Geary County by sharing their time, effort, expertise, and more. Every 4-H member is challenged to call and/or write a volunteer and thank them for all they do for the 4-H program.
Goat/Sheep/Swine Weigh-in	Weigh-in and tagging for goats, sheep, and swine will be held on May 20 from 5:30 to 7:00pm and May 22 from 6:30 to 8:00pm at the Fairgrounds. If you do not plan to attend weigh-in, ear tags can be picked up at the Extension Office. Goats, sheep, and swine must be tagged by May 23 and tag forms are due to the Extension Office by 5:00pm on May 23. Ear tags will cost \$3.00 each. If you plan to nominate livestock for state shows, you must attend weigh-in or make alternate arrangements for an extension agent to see the tag in the animal's ear in-person to meet state nomination requirements.

4-H Overnight Camp Deadline for Financial Support	The deadline to sign up for 4-H camp at Rock Springs and receive financial support in the amount of \$225 from the Geary County 4-H Foundation is May 1. Use the discount code GECOCAMP25 when you register to have these funds applied to your account. The code will need to be added for each camper's registration. In order to be eligible for this financial support, 4-H members must have been enrolled in 4HOnline by January 1, 2025. 4-H Discovery Days	Kansas 4-H Discovery Days will be held June 4-6 at Kansas State University. This event is open to all youth 13 to 18 years old by January 1, 2025. The Discovery Days fee is \$225 plus class fees, but Geary County 4-H members who were enrolled by January 1 and complete a scholarship request form that is available at the Extension Office or at <u>http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-</u> <u>h/forms.html</u> will only pay half of the fee. The Geary County 4-H Foundation will pay the other half. Delegates will have the opportunity to attend classes of their choosing and will participate in evening activities. Registration deadline is May 5.

Bucket Calf ID Forms Due	Bucket Calf ID forms are due May 20 by 5:00pm in the Extension Office. Bucket Calf ID's are required in order to show your calf at the County Fair. Forms can be found online at <u>https://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/forms.html</u> . Forms are also available at the Extension Office and can be mailed on request. Contact the Extension Office for more information.

Identification of Horses for 4-H Shows	Kansas 4-H Horse ID papers or breed association registration papers are due June 2nd by 5:00pm in the Extension Office. This is required in order to show your horse at the County Fair and State Fair. They may also be required for other 4-H horse shows. Due to the passage of KAR 9-7-14 from the Kansas Department of Agriculture, all equine exhibitions require proof of a negative ETA (Coggins) test for participation. To comply with the regulation, we will be requiring a negative test result in the last 12 months to show at the Geary County 4-H Horse Show. Test results will be required on June 1st in addition to the ID/Breed Registration papers. Contact the Extension Office for more information.	

The procedure to qualify to participate in the State Fair 4-H Horse Show will continue for 2025. If you are interested in participating, please visit <u>https://www.kansas4-h.org/projects/animal-science/horse/HorseChangesPublic9.8.pdf</u> to read all of the details. Check this out now so you can start planning how you will qualify for the show in September.
The state livestock nomination season is an online process. It is going to be IMPERATIVE for you to plan ahead this year. You will not be able to wait until the last minute and successfully complete the process. Market Beef nominations will be due on May 1. All other species, which includes commercial heifers, market swine, commercial gilts, market lambs, commercial ewes, and ALL meat goats, will be due June 15. You will need to order nomination DNA envelopes at least 10 days ahead of these deadlines. Details on YQCA requirements are included on this site as well.
Hazardous Occupations Safety Training in Agriculture is required by law for those 14 and 15 years of age to complete prior to working on a farm operated by anyone other than their parent or legal guardian. Older youth are also welcome to participate in a training hosted by Geary and five other Extension Offices June 2 nd and 3 rd . New this year is a one day safety training on June 2 nd focused on general farm and rural safety. Participants will not receive an official certification but will learn more about how to be safe. Registration information and additional details will be available soon.
Wednesday, April 23 (office professional's day) is the date designated this year to let Christina and Traci know how much we appreciate the work they do in the Extension Office. They work hard to keep the Geary County 4-H programming running smoothly and we are very appreciative!
4-H members will be required to <u>attend in-person at least 4 regular monthly</u> <u>meetings of the 4-H club in which they are enrolled between October 1 and June</u> <u>30</u> to participate in the project/livestock auction held at the end of the fair in 2025. Official record of meetings attended will be the club secretary's book. This requirement does not limit fair participation, only participation in the auction. Plan ahead now to make sure youth meet the requirement if they want to participate in the auction
