RESPONSIBILITIES OF GEARY COUNTY 4-H KING, QUEEN, ROYAL COURT, & CANDIDATES

- ❖ Candidates must ride in the Sundown Salute Parade in Junction City on July 4 to earn the 10 points given in that category (out of 200 total points).
- ❖ Each candidate must visit one Geary County 4-H Club other than their own, and give a brief speech encouraging members to stay in 4-H by highlighting advantages of being a teen member, benefits of continued membership, etc. Club assignments will be made by the Geary County 4-H Agent and the visit must be verified by club leaders. Candidates must complete this requirement before July 11, 2019 to be eligible for King or Queen.
- ❖ Every candidate needs to be present for announcement of the new King and Queen at the Public Fashion Revue on Thursday, July 18 at the Geary County 4-H/Senior Citizens Center. Each candidate is strongly encouraged to be available for recognition prior to the Thursday, July 25 Project and Livestock Auction.

King and Queen responsibilities are as follows:

- ❖ Coordinate participation and ride in the Sundown Salute Parade in Junction City on July 4 of the following year
- ❖ Present ribbons at various county fair events
- ❖ Help hand out awards at the Annual 4-H Achievement Celebration
- ❖ Give a greeting at the Annual 4-H Achievement Celebration
- ❖ Promote 4-H in some way during National 4-H Week
- ❖ Assist with King and Queen candidate interviews and judging the following year
- ❖ Solicit donations and prizes, and purchase items as necessary for the following year's candidates
- ❖ Participate in the following year's crowning ceremony
- ❖ Meet with media as requested to promote the county fair and 4-H in general
- ❖ Visit and speak at 4-H meetings when requested
- ❖ Other duties as requested by Geary County 4-H Youth Development, to include appearances at the Junction City Rodeo.

The top two scorers under the King and Queen will be designated as members of the Royal Court. They will be asked to assist with presenting ribbons at various county fair events, and may be requested to perform other duties as a 4-H representative throughout the year.
