Officer Training	4-H Officer Training has been scheduled for <b>Tuesday</b> , <b>November 14</b> at 6:30pm at Pottorf Hall on the Riley County Fairgrounds in Manhattan. This will be a multi-county training with Riley County. All club officers should mark this on their calendars and plan to attend.
Record Book Screening	Geary County will be in charge of screening our own records this year. Screening will be held <b>October 5 from 8:30am to 7:00pm</b> at the Extension Office. Each club is responsible for providing at least <u>4 adults</u> to screen records. Older 4-H members are also welcome to judge. No parent will be allowed to screen records for their own child. Please think about participating in this great learning experience that will help you to gain new ideas. You don't have to be a record book "expert" to participate.
4-H Enrollment	Required online enrollment for 4-H members is continuing for the 2023-24 4-H year. The system is currently shut down to prepare for enrollment but is expected to reopen at 8:00am on October 1. More information on how to re-enroll online will be sent out via email on October 2.
Kansas 4-H Program Fee	Just a reminder that Kansas 4-H will continue to charge a \$15 fee per 4-H member (not including Cloverbuds) per year. Fortunately, the Geary County 4-H Foundation Board of Directors has agreed to pay this fee for all Geary County 4-H members at this time. <u>Pay special attention to instructions that will be sent out with enrollment information on how to complete the payment portions of enrollment. If you pay the fee by credit card or check, you will not be reimbursed.</u>
Achievement Celebration	The Achievement Celebration has been set for the evening of Saturday, October 28 at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center. It will begin at 6:00pm with a potluck supper. Each family is asked to bring a main dish AND side dish or dessert. Table service and drinks will be provided. Hope to see you there to celebrate the end of another great 4-H year!

Kansas Youth Leadership Forum	The Kansas Youth Leadership Forum is an exciting event for youth 14-18 years old as of January 1, 2024. This event will be held at Rock Springs, November 18-19. Highlights of the forum will be inspirational speakers, workshops, and meeting new people. Registration is open and is due October 16 with a cost of \$200. Kansas 4-H Youth Leadership Council	Applications are available for the Kansas 4-H Youth Leadership Council and are due October 2. Council members plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum, Citizenship in Action, and other events along with other duties. 4-H members 14 to 18 years old as of January 1, 2024 are eligible to apply. Contact the Extension Office for further information.
National 4-H Conference	Applications are available for the 2024 National 4-H Conference to be held April 19-24, 2024. Delegates must be 15 to 18 years old as of January 1, 2024. The National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs nationally and in their communities. Up to six Kansas youth may be selected as delegates via an application and interview. Applications are due online by October 2 <sup>nd</sup> . Contact the Extension Office for further information.

State 4-H Dog Conference will be held October 21-22 at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Registration is due by October 1. Conference events include educational sessions, quiz bowl, skillathon, and many others. Cost is \$155 for full-time participants and \$80 for Sunday only. The Geary County 4-H Foundation will pay half of the fee for Geary County 4-H members who complete a scholarship request form that is available at the Extension Office or online at <u>http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/forms.html</u> .
Yard signs for National 4-H Week are available at September 4-H Club meetings and at the Extension Office. If you pick up a yard sign, don't forget to return it to your October club meeting or to the Extension Office so we can use them in future years.
Each club needs to select 2 youth and 2 adults as 4-H Council Representatives. The youth and adults that you select will be able to help make decisions about the county 4-H program. The next council meeting will be October 2 at 7:00pm at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center. We will be reviewing the fair, electing officers, and assigning committees for the coming year. If you sent exhibits to the State Fair, please plan to pick them up at the Extension Office any time after 8:00am on Tuesday, September 19. Standards for Participation in Kansas FFA and 4-H Youth Development Educational Opportunities	The purpose of the standards outlined below are to assist in determining eligible participation in FFA and/or 4-H Youth Development learning experiences. Both 4-H and Agriculture Education/FFA promote teaching youth life skills. Each program exists to maximize the participants' knowledge of agriculture and its value to our communities while educating the young people to become productive citizens. Eligible youth may participate in both 4-H and FFA but should avoid duplication. The following standards of participation are used in delivering the 4-H and FFA programs in Kansas. <ol> <li>Agriculture Education teachers, FFA Advisors, Extension staff and local volunteers are encouraged to cooperate in sharing information and resources to provide educational opportunities for youth.</li> <li>When young people are members of both 4-H and FFA, they must plan and manage separate projects, and/or supervised agriculture experiences (SAE) programs.</li> <li>FFA and 4-H members may enroll in the same area of experience in 4-H and FFA, however; participants cannot identify, nominate, manage, keep records on, or exhibit the same plants, animals, etc. in both organizations. Members must designate exhibits as either FFA or 4-H at weigh-in, registration or similar deadline.</li> <li>Members may participate in judging contests and related events in FFA and 4-H but cannot represent both organizations at a contest, show or event at the same time.</li> <li>When 4-H and FFA are conducting collaborating activities, both the 4-H and FFA organizations must be represented through emblems and information on all signs, print materials and awards.</li> <li>Collaborating FFA and 4-H activities or events are obligated to have supervision representation from both organizations.</li> </ol>
Animals in the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center	Just a reminder that the 4-H/Senior Citizens Building Committee has made the decision that no animals will be allowed in the kitchen or dining room at the building and animals will be allowed in the rest of the building by permission only. Please contact the Extension Office if you need to get permission for animals to be allowed in the building (permission has already been given for 4-H Dog project meetings). We ask that all 4-H families follow this policy.
Photography Contest Opportunity	Kansas 4-H and Kansas Farm Bureau have teamed up for a photography contest. 4-H members who enter have a chance to win up to \$50 and be featured in Kansas Living Magazine.
