4-H Enrollment

Online enrollment continues for the 2023-24 4-H year. The system is open at

https://v2.4honline.com/. Step-by-step enrollment instructions and a list of projects were sent via email on October 1 and are available at http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/forms.html. The Geary County 4-H Foundation will pay the \$15 enrollment fee for all Geary County 4-H members (there is no fee for Cloverbuds). You will need to input the coupon code GSQILC. If you pay the fee by credit card or check, you will not be reimbursed. Adult volunteers are encouraged to enroll now as well. The Geary County 4-H Foundation has set an enrollment deadline of January 1 in order to receive scholarship funding from the foundation for the current 4-H year. Please make sure 4-H members are enrolled by January 1 in order to receive any event scholarship funds (including 4-H Camp) and/or post-secondary education scholarships made available by the foundation.

Fair Auction
Participation
Requirement for 2024

4-H members will be required to <u>attend in-person at least 4 regular monthly</u> meetings of the 4-H club in which they are enrolled between October 1 and June <u>30</u> to participate in the project/livestock auction held at the end of the fair in 2024. Official record of meetings attended will be the club secretary's book. This requirement does not limit fair participation, only participation in the auction. Plan ahead now to make sure youth meet the requirement if they want to participate in the auction.

Officer Training Make-Up

An online record book option is available for use by Kansas 4-H members. Youth may choose to use the online ZBooks software or the fillable PDF Project Report Forms. The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks for the first time this year, you will start the permanent record with the current year and simply attach it to your previous document after printing. Visit https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/awards-and-recognition/ZBooks.html for access to ZBooks and helpful tutorials. This software works on all platforms and should make keeping up with record books throughout the year a lot easier. In ZBooks, pictures can be entered in landscape or portrait format. At the end of the year, you will print your Project Report Forms and Permanent Record and submit them just like you would in previous years. If you want to try ZBooks, click on the link above and create a family account and then profiles for each of your 4-H members. If you have questions or problems while using the program, they have a wonderful live chat feature that you can use.

Early-bird registration for 4-H members to attend 4-H Camp at a 10% discount this summer is available November 15 through December 31. Some details are included below.

- The Geary County 4-H Foundation will give support to Geary County 4-H members in the amount of \$225 for camp experiences at Rock Springs (this replaces the half scholarships given for camp in the past since there are now multiple options and prices for camp). <u>Use the discount code GECOCAMP24</u> when you register to have these funds applied to your account. The code will need to be added for each camper's registration.
- We are not selecting a preferred camp session this year. Your family can choose whatever session works best for you.
- There are camp options for youth currently in 1st grade and older, including teens. Teen programs are Leader in Training and Counselor in Training. Full scholarships for both teen programs are available.
- Camp prices remain the same as they were in 2023 with 3 tiers of pricing available. Choose the one that works for your family.

We will continue the procedure used in the past for those unable to attend officer training that was held November 14th. To make up that training, and have it count for your club, first call or stop by the Extension Office and let us know what office you hold and get your training materials. The training materials will include a worksheet that you will need to fill out. Once this is completed, you can contact the Extension Office at 785-238-4161 or email Ginger at gkopfer@ksu.edu to schedule an appointment to go over the information and ask questions. These appointments can be in-person or via Zoom and should take approximately 10 minutes. You will then be counted as having completed officer training for this year.
