Officer Training

4-H Officer Training has been scheduled for **Sunday, November 9** starting at 3:00pm at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center and will be finished by 4:15pm in time to set up for the 4-H Foundation Bingo/Soup Supper that evening. All club officers should mark this on their calendars and plan to attend.

Officer Training Make-Up

We will continue the procedure used in the past for those unable to attend officer training. To make up that training, and have it count for your club, first call or stop by the Extension Office and let us know what office you hold and get your training materials. The training materials will include a worksheet that you will need to fill out. Once this is completed, you can contact the Extension Office at 785-238-4161 or email Ginger at gkopfer@ksu.edu to schedule an appointment to go over the information and ask questions. These appointments can be inperson or via Zoom and should take approximately 10 minutes. You will then be counted as having completed officer training for this year. Meetings must be completed by December 22nd at the latest.

4-H Enrollment

Online enrollment continues for the 2025-26 4-H year. The system is open at https://v2.4honline.com/. Step-by-step enrollment instructions and a list of projects were sent via email with the October newsletter and are available at http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/forms.html. The Geary County 4-H Foundation will pay the \$15 enrollment fee for all Geary County 4-H members (there is no fee for Cloverbuds). You will need to input the coupon code QYDTAO. If you pay the fee by credit card or check, you will not be reimbursed. Adult volunteers are encouraged to enroll now as well (instructions are available at the above website).

2026 Fair Theme

The fair theme for 2026 will be a birthday theme in celebration of the 100th Geary County Fair and 100 years of Extension in Geary County. The theme will be titled "Centennial Celebration".

Fair Auction Participation Requirement for 2026

4-H members will be required to <u>attend in-person at least 4 regular monthly</u> meetings of the 4-H club in which they are enrolled between October 1 and June 30 to participate in the project/livestock auction held at the end of the fair in 2026. Official record of meetings attended will be the club secretary's book. This requirement does not limit fair participation, only participation in the auction. Plan ahead now to make sure youth meet the requirement if they want to participate in the auction.

Geary County and Kansas 4-H Post-Secondary **Scholarships**

Applications for county and state 4-H scholarships are due by January 5th. The link for the county scholarship application and information can be found online at http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/forms.html. The list of county scholarships that are available this year will be the Paul and Clara Gwin Scholarship, the Ralph Dietrich Scholarship, two Ray and Nellie Smith 4-H Scholarships, the Flint Hills Preservation Coalition Scholarship, and three Geary County 4-H Foundation Scholarships. Record Book Online

An online record book option is available for use by Kansas 4-H members. Youth may choose to use the online ZBooks software or the fillable PDF Project Report Forms. The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks for the first time this year, you will start the permanent record with the current year and simply attach it to your previous document after printing. Visit https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/awards-andrecognition/ZBooks.html for access to ZBooks and helpful tutorials. This software works on all platforms and should make keeping up with record books throughout the year a lot easier. In ZBooks, pictures can be entered in landscape or portrait format. At the end of the year, you will print your Project Report Forms and Permanent Record and submit them just like you would in previous years. If you want to try ZBooks, click on the link above and create a family account and then profiles for each of your 4-H members. If you have questions or problems while using the program, they have a wonderful live chat feature that you can use.
