State Fair Exhibits

If you are sending exhibits to state fair, you need to have the exhibit to the Extension Office by **Wednesday, September 3rd at 5:00pm**. If it is a food or produce item, you can deliver it from 7:00am to 7:30am on Thursday, September 4th. 4-H members with exhibits pre-entered were sent an email with additional information. Exhibits can be picked up at the Extension Office any time after 8:00am on Tuesday, September 16th. We appreciate having exhibits picked up soon after the end of the fair. Contact the Extension Office if you have questions.

Record Books & Award Applications due Record Books, Key Award Applications, I Dare You Award Applications, and Achievement Pin Applications are due to club leaders in September. Check with your club to find out the deadline. The county deadline will be communicated to club leaders so they can turn in items by that time.

Record Book Screening

Geary County will be in charge of screening our own records this year. Screening will be held **September 30**th **from 8:30am to 7:00pm** at the Extension Office. Each club is responsible for providing at least <u>4 adults</u> to screen records. Older 4-H members are also welcome to judge. No parent will be allowed to screen records for their own child. Please think about participating in this great learning experience that will help you to gain new ideas. You don't have to be a record book "expert" to participate.

4-H Enrollment

Required online enrollment for 4-H members is continuing for the 2025-26 4-H year. The system is currently shut down to prepare for enrollment but is expected to reopen on October 1st. More information on how to re-enroll online will be sent out via email at the beginning of October.

Kansas 4-H Program Fee

Just a reminder that Kansas 4-H will continue to charge a \$15 fee per 4-H member (not including Cloverbuds) per year. Fortunately, the Geary County 4-H Foundation Board of Directors has agreed to pay this fee for all Geary County 4-H members at this time. Pay special attention to instructions that will be sent out with enrollment information on how to complete the payment portions of enrollment. If you pay the fee by credit card or check, you will not be reimbursed.

National 4-H Week/48 Hours of 4-H

Don't forget National 4-H Week, October 5 through 11. Plan to participate in Geary County's National 4-H Week opportunities and 48 Hours of 4-H Service Weekend. Plans are still being finalized, but look for an email by mid-September with all the details.

Yard Signs for National 4-H Week

Yard signs for National 4-H Week will be made available at September 4-H Club meetings. Signs will also be available to be picked up at the Extension Office. Size of signs is 24 inches by 18 inches and they will come with a metal holder to stake the sign into the ground. Plan to get one at your club meeting or the Extension Office and promote 4-H during this special week! We ask that signs are returned to October club meetings or to the Extension Office so we can use them in future years.

Achievement Celebration

The Achievement Celebration has been set for the evening of Saturday, October 25th at the 4-H/Senior Citizens Center. Setup will be held at 1:00pm (all help is greatly appreciated). The celebration will begin at 6:30pm (we are starting a little later this year) with a potluck supper. Each family is asked to bring a main dish AND side dish or dessert. Table service and drinks will be provided. Hope to see you there to celebrate the end of another great 4-H year!

Kansas Youth Leadership Forum

The Kansas Youth Leadership Forum is an exciting event for youth 14-18 years old as of January 1, 2026. This event will be held at Rock Springs, November 22-23. Highlights of the forum will be inspirational speakers, workshops, and meeting new people. Kansas 4-H Youth Leadership Council

Applications are available for the Kansas 4-H Youth Leadership Council and are due October 1st. Council members plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum, Citizenship in Action, and other events along with other duties. 4-H members 14 to 18 years old as of January 1, 2026 are eligible to apply. National 4-H Conference

Applications are available for the 2026 National 4-H Conference to be held in the spring. Delegates must be 15 to 18 years old as of January 1, 2026. The National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs nationally and in their communities. Up to six Kansas youth may be selected as delegates via an application and interview. Applications are due online by October 1st. Contact the Extension Office for further information.

State 4-H Dog Conference

The Kansas 4-H Dog Conference is an opportunity for 4-H Dog project members, their families and volunteers to gather, learn, network, and increase their skills at Rock Springs Ranch. This year's conference, "Trails and Tails" will be held October 18-19. Conference sessions include Weaving Trails of Adventure (making paracord leashes), searching with K-9 Kreed, dog photography, and dog safety on the trails. 4-H members have the opportunity to participate in public speaking, photography, and quiz bowl contests. Registration is currently open and complete conference information is available at https://www.kansas4-h.org/educational-experiences/project-based-events/conferences-events/dog/dog-conference/. Early bird registration is due September 19th. Cost is \$170 for full-time participants and \$100 for Sunday only. The Geary County 4-H Foundation will pay half of the fee for Geary County 4-H members who complete a scholarship request form that is available at the Extension Office or online at http://www.geary.k-state.edu/4-h/forms.html.

4-H Council

Each club needs to select 2 youth and 2 adults as 4-H Council Representatives. The youth and adults who you select will be able to help make decisions about the county 4-H program. The purpose of the standards outlined below are to assist in determining eligible participation in FFA and/or 4-H Youth Development learning experiences. Both 4-H and Agriculture Education/FFA promote teaching youth life skills. Each

program exists to maximize the participants' knowledge of agriculture and its value to our communities while educating the young people to become productive citizens. Eligible youth may participate in both 4-H and FFA but should avoid duplication. The following standards of participation are used in delivering the 4-H and FFA programs in Kansas.

1. Agriculture Education teachers, FFA Advisors, Extension staff and local volunteers are encouraged to cooperate in sharing information and resources to provide educational opportunities for youth.

- 2. When young people are members of both 4-H and FFA, they must plan and manage separate projects, and/or supervised agriculture experiences (SAE) programs.
- 3. FFA and 4-H members may enroll in the same area of experience in 4-H and FFA, however; participants cannot identify, nominate, manage, keep records on, or exhibit the same plants, animals, etc. in both organizations. Members must designate exhibits as either FFA or 4-H at weigh-in, registration or similar deadline.
- 4. Members may participate in judging contests and related events in FFA and 4-H but cannot represent both organizations at a contest, show or event at the same time.
- 5. When 4-H and FFA are conducting collaborating activities, both the 4-H and FFA organizations must be represented through emblems and information on all signs, print materials and awards.
- 6. Collaborating FFA and 4-H activities or events are obligated to have supervision representation from both organizations.
