USD 475, Geary County Schools

Starting date for school, August 31.

The school year will end June 10, 2021. Gov. Laura Kelly announced more than \$9 million in grants for projects to strengthen the state's food supply system. 183 Kansas agriculture and food-related businesses in more than 70 counties were awarded grants as part of the Securing Local Food Systems grant program. To qualify for the grant, businesses must have less than 200 employees. Along with meat processing plants, farmers, ranchers and community food organizations received funds.

**The Securing Local Food** Systems grant is one of several grants made possible in the second round of the federal CARES Act funding and approved by the **Strengthening People and Revitalizing Kansas (SPARK)** Task Force. It was created to increase capacity of Kansas' local food systems and available to for-profit and not-for-profit businesses, including direct-to-consumer producers/growers/vendors, food processors, slaughter and processing facilities, food banks, pantries, soup kitchens, farmers' markets, and retail food outlets such as grocery stores.

As a result, SNAP households will see an increase in their benefits starting this month. Nearly all states have opted to automatically provide all SNAP households the maximum benefit for their household size under legislation passed in response to the pandemic. With the increased maximum benefit amounts, a typical household of four will receive \$680 a month, up from the previous amount of \$646.

In collaboration with the Geary County Health Department, the USD 475 school district asks that if your children have been in direct contact with someone with COVID-19, if they are waiting for the results of a test or are positive for COVID-19, please call the Geary County Health Department at 785-762-5788 as soon as possible. This will enable contact tracing and isolation/quarantine orders to be given so that the student's absence is justified. This will help both USD 475 and the Geary County Health contain COVID-19. \*All schools allow remote learner lunch pickup from 10:30 to 11:30 am.

Free virtual tutoring is available for students.

Starting date for school, August 31.

Teachers will return to work, August 20.

The school year will end June 10, 2021. USDA announced the continued extension of nationwide flexibilities that allow free school meals for all children throughout the entire 2020-2021 school year.

USDA has approved a program to provide school free meals to ALL students. Breakfast and Lunch meals are being provided free to all USD 475 students starting immediately, regardless of whether the student qualifies for free or reduced price, or pays full price. Students do not need to do anything special to receive free meals. The free meals will apply to in-person students as well as remote learners, and all grades from Pre-K to 12th.

### **Remote Meals:**

District students can pick up food from any school. The only requirement is that the be enrolled in the District.

The federal food program contains an accountability requirement, that the child must be seen in order for a meal(s) to be distributed. However, the program does allow for a waiver from the Food Service Director when the need is deemed legitimate and documented accordingly.
